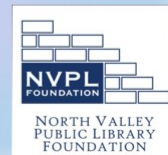

May 30, registration for the Summer Reading Challenge, Rubber Duck Reading Club and Science Club begins.

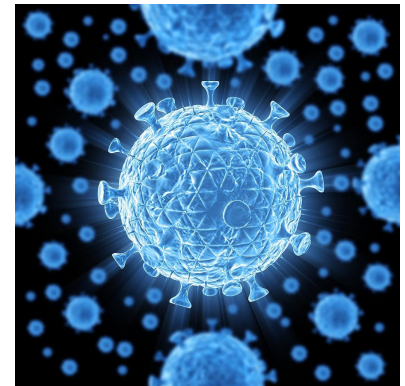

Rocky Mountain Labs: Predicting Pandemics

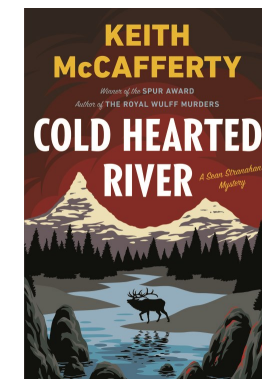
Dr. Marshall Bloom is giving a lecture on predicting pandemics on June 22, at 6pm.

An Associate Director at Rocky Mountain Labs (RML), Dr. Bloom played a major role in design, construction and staffing of the RML Integrated Research Facility, which houses NIAID's first Biosafety Level 4 research program. He is considered an authority on biosafety, biocontainment and management of high containment laboratory research programs.

Dr Bloom is a recognized expert on the pathogenesis of tick-borne flaviviruses, persistent infections and parvoviruses, has written numerous scientific articles and is the recipient of many honors and awards.



Author of the Month is Montana Author, Keith McCafferty



If you have not read Keith McCafferty you may need to start. The Sean Stranahan series follows a fly fisher, painter, and has-been private detective through his mystery-solving escapades. You can find all McCafferty's novels in the Montana Room of the Library. He is the winner of the Spur Award for Best Western Contemporary Novel. His newest book, *Cold Hearted River*, is coming out this July. It is the sixth novel in the acclaimed Sean Stranahan mystery series. Montana's favorite detective is on the trail of Ernest Hemingway's missing steamer trunk. The library ordered all of McCafferty's titles on audio CD for those of you that prefer to listen to your books.
